

**Dylan, Kennedy, Henry Miller + the Beatles...
Great 20th Century Treasures
At Auction December 14**

In the pivotal early 1960's, a young folk singer left the heartland and arrived in the big city. Not long after, he recorded his first record album. The world has never been the same since.

Known to the world as Bob Dylan, the original master tape recordings from his landmark album will be sold at auction by Guernsey's on December 14th with the proceeds to benefit the blind. And although the Dylan Tapes by themselves should be enough to get anyone's juices flowing, they will be joined by other 20th Century treasures including an astonishing archive of famed author Henry Miller's writings, President Kennedy's Moon-landing note, a coveted and extremely rare Beatles' sealed "White Album," a wonderful Eddie Van Halen guitar, Elvis Presley's sixth grade report card, unpublished Kareem Abdul-Jabbar letters, a stunning 1985 Lamborghini Countach and, well, you get the picture.

Simply titled "Bob Dylan," the legendary musician's first album contained 13 songs including "Man of Constant Sorrow," "Song to Woody," and "Highway 51." They were recorded on three professional reels of tape, complete with outtakes, unreleased songs and dialogue between Bob and John Hammond, his producer. Most importantly, it was this record that introduced Dylan to the world. Given to a young blind man in the mid-1960's, a portion of the proceeds from the sale of these tapes are being donated to an organization that aids the Blind.

Written in 1934 and banned for a quarter century in the US due to its candid sexuality, Henry Miller's classic "Tropic of Cancer" became the lynchpin credited for today's freedom of the press. As such, it is well beyond simply a highly acclaimed book; it is a landmark. Late in his life, Miller - who went on to pen many other books - struck up a torrid relationship with a young, intelligent beauty queen. More than 500 handwritten letters resulted from that affair... they are passionate and explicit, and go on to air Miller's opinionated views on other writers, music and film, politics, religion and, you name it.
